

Scalia Keynote Speaker at Hofstra Conference

Associate Justice Antonin Scalia will deliver the keynote address at this year's Ethics Conference of the Hofstra University School of Law. The Conference will be held over three days, Sunday, September 9 through Tuesday, September 11, 2001. The theme of the Conference is "Legal Ethics: What Needs Fixing?" The Conference Directors are Professors Monroe H. Freedman and Roy D. Simon, both members of the Hofstra law school faculty.

Speakers at the Conference will identify and discuss major questions about the way lawyers behave, how the legal profession regulates its members, and how the profession and the public may deal with the regulation of lawyers. The speakers will deliver original papers reflecting their individual interests and their contribution to the conference theme.

A roster of twenty-four of the nation's leading authorities on legal ethics and professionalism will participate in the Conference. Many practitioners will also participate, including Lawrence Fox, Drinker Biddle & Reath LLP; Carol Langford, Langford & Bell; Lucien Pera, Armstrong Allen; and Steven Krane, Proskauer Rose.

The Registration Fee for the full conference is \$250. The fee for any one of the three days alone is \$100. A 20% discount is offered for all registration forms postmarked by Friday, August 10, 2001. Senior citizens (over 65) and law school students are admitted without charge at all events except the Sunday banquet at which Justice Scalia will speak.
